Daily Schedule

8:00-8:30

Arrival | Students may choose from a variety of quiet indoor activities like board games, building with blocks, drawing, or approved technology based activities

8:30-8:45

Group Launch | Students and teachers will begin the day with a morning meeting.

8:45-10:00

Core Learning Block 1 | Students will work on literacy or math, depending on grouping. This block of time will include a combination of technology, independent work, group work, and time to work with the teacher. This will vary daily depending upon the needs of the students.

10:00-10:45

Morning Snack and Break | Students may eat a snack brought from home and engage in supervised, unstructured free time in one of the many outdoor spaces on the property.

10:45-12:00

Core Learning Block 2 | Students will work on literacy or math, depending on grouping. This block of time will include a combination of technology, independent work, group work, and time to work with the teacher. This will vary daily depending upon the needs of the students.

*Students will switch to whichever subject they did not complete during the first learning block.

12:00-1:30

Lunch and Break | Students will eat a lunch brought from home and engage in choice time. Break will be taken outside as often as possible.

1:30-2:30

Project Based Learning | Students will engage in the study of social studies, science and art through thematic units and project based learning. Students will be grouped according to age, ability, and interest, and affinity, depending upon the unit of study.

2:30-3:00

Closing | Students will finish their tasks, pack their bags and eat a snack brought from home.

3:00-3:30

Choice Time and Dismal | Students may engage in a variety of activities. Depending on the day, this may be involve indoor or outdoor play

Programs + Curriculum

ACRES offers several curriculum options for students depending upon age and ability. Each student will complete a pre-assessment as a part of the enrollment process. This will serve as a baseline for academic progress as well as inform curriculum decisions. Final decisions about curriculum will be made jointly by the director and parents to make sure your child is getting the education they need and deserve and focuses on what you as a family find important. Explore the curriculum options below.

READING/ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS



Logic of English | Students who are developing or struggling readers will use this phonograph based reading program. It systematically teaches all of the sounds of the English Language to give students a strong foundation in decoding while also fostering comprehension.



Institute for Excellence in Writing | Students who are proficient readers will use this systematic writing course to ensure the development of strong communication skills. Students will also be expected to read independently and apply their communication skills to discuss or write about the literature they read.

MATH

ST Math | Students who are developing number sense, working on basic math skills, and fact fluency will typically use this visual an interactive online math program. It is designed to build a strong understanding of basic math concepts and gradually increases in difficultly as kids master skills.



Math-U-See | Students working in ST Math will also utilize portions of this program. This is a mastery based program that utilizes manipulatives will be used to reinforce important foundational math concepts in small group or one on one instruction as needed.



Khan Academy | This is an compilation of online, self-paced math courses that includes video instruction, practice, and assessment through a gamified points based system. Students using this program, will need proficient reading skills in order to complete tasks.



PROGRESS MONITORING



回解袋! i-Ready | This diagnostic and assessment suite will be used to determine proper curriculum placement, monitor progress mid year, and provide end of year assessment data that is required by the state if using EFA funding.

Students will also compile portfolios with work samples to demonstrate their knowledge, skills, and growth throughout the year. This includes reports and assessments generated by the learning programs used daily.











Hybrid Microschool

ACRES is a hybrid model microschool. Read about what this means and expectations below.

Microschool is simply a reference to the size and age composition of the school. We use a multi-age model where kids of different ages learn with and from each other. The classes are kept intentionally small to ensure that teachers are able to truly know your kids, where they are at academically, socially, and emotionally, and to ensure personalized attention that can be difficult to get in a traditional classroom.

Hybrid means part time school, part time homeschool. All students are registered homeschoolers, but ACRES will provide core instruction and curriculum in reading and math as well as opportunities for project based learning in social studies, science, and art.

ACRES Responsibility

- Provide Reading and Math curriculum and materials
- Provide instruction and learning on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday
- Provide project based learning opportunities and organize occaisional field trips
- Monitor student progress through formative (informal) and summative (norm referenced) assessments
- Provide ample opportunities to play and explore with friends.
- Provide technology for student use at school.



Family Responsibility

- Facilitate learning using curriculum provided by the school and keep records of work on Monday and Friday. (or Saturday or Sunday, whatever works for your schedule)
- Provide any enrichment opportunities outside of school hours that your kids may be interested in (ex. music, karate, dance, sports, etc.)
- Provide technology for student use outside of school. (Arrangements can be made to use school technology upon request and for a fee)







Tuition + Enrollment

Tuition

ACRES will be able to accept Educational Freedom Account funds in the 2024-2025 school year as a homeschool expense. Tuition will be handled on a case by case basis, based on whether your family qualifies for funding. Your family may qualify for EFA funding if your child meets one or more of the following criteria. EFA funding will be open to all families in 2025-2026. Applications to apply for the EFA program are tentatively set to open in March.

- Students who are entering kindergarten for the first time
- Students who have a diagnosis covered under IDEA
- Students who are or have ever been considered homeless
- Students who are or have ever been in foster care
- Students with a parent in the household who is active duty military, veteran, or reservist
- Students with a parent in the household who is law enforcement or a first responder (fire, police, EMT, including volunteer positions)

Enrollment Steps

Fill out the Interest Form

This is an important information collecting step that gets you a spot in line. There is no fee or commitment, but you cannot proceed with enrollment without first filling out this form.

In Person Meeting at the School

This is an informal visit where you are able to check out the learning space and ask any questions you may have. Events will be scheduled during the enrollment season or you can set up a private meeting. Be sure your bring your child!

Application and Registration Fee

\$50 Fee covers the cost of on-boarding and pre-assessment.

Placement Testing

This will take place over the summer and is required for correct curriculum placement.

Receive Handbook and Sign Contract

The handbook outlines all the policies, practices, and expectations. Upon reviewing, you will sign a contract indicating your agreement.

Pay First Month's Tuition or Submit EFA Documentation

First month's tuition is due by July 30. If using EFA funds, this payment will be handled through the state portal.
